Call for Nominations

Focus on Fibre Art Association (FFAA), is looking for interested people to join our Executive. We are seeking nominations for three executive positions to be elected at the AGM in February 2022: President, Vice-President, and Secretary.

Focus on Fibre Art Association is a not-for-profit association. We:

- offer workshops and events that promote skill development
- host competitions and exhibitions that showcase the creativity of fibre artists
- rent a large workspace that is available to members for non-profit events at no cost depending on membership numbers.

Eligibility

Individual Members of the FFAA and "Members in Good Standing" of the following guilds are eligible for nomination: Alberta Council for Ukrainian Arts, Black Gold Quilt Patch Guild (Leduc), Edmonton & District Quilters' Guild, Edmonton Modern Quilt Guild, Edmonton Needlecraft Guild, Edmonton Rug Hooking Guild, Edmonton Weavers' Guild, and Latchet Machine Knitting Club.

Term Limits and Meetings:

Executive terms are for two years with a maximum of two consecutive terms starting after the February 2022 AGM. Board Meetings are held at least 10 months of the year. Executive Meetings are shall be called by the President as necessary.

Executive member responsibilities:

The **President** presides at FFAA meetings; sits as an ex officio member of all committees; prepares agendas for the meetings with the Secretary; acts as spokesperson for FFAA; and carries out other duties assigned by the Board.

The Vice-President attends all meetings of FFAA, chairs meetings if the President is absent, and carries out other duties assigned by the Board.

The **Secretary** attends all meetings of FFAA; keeps accurate Minutes; keeps an archive of Minutes; keeps a membership record; sends all notices of the meetings; keeps the Seal of FFAA; and files formal documents with the Corporate Registry, including: annual return, financial statement/financial review, changes in directors of the organization, and amendments to the Bylaws and other incorporating documents.


Call for Nominations - Committee Chairs

Moyozashi stitch sampler by Vicki Robson (Kate Ward Sashiko workshops)


Change to FFAA membership terms and fees

FFAA membership terms and fees are changing effective January 1, 2022. Membership will now be for a one-year term from January 1 to December 31 (Article 3.2.4 of the revised Bylaws registered February 2021). Annual membership fees will now be \$10 for Individual members and \$5 for Junior members and will be the same regardless of when application for membership is made during the year. Individual memberships for the 2021-2022 term will continue, as before, to December 31, 2022. FFAA Studio

Welcome back for 2022! The Studio is waiting for you.

If you would like to book Studio time, please email: studio@focusonfibreart.org. Studio information can be found here on our website: http://focusonfibreart.org/ffaa-studio-events/.

There are 12 tables set up and a raised cutting table with room for 14 tables (maintaining distancing requirements) if needed. You can change the set up to whatever your group requires. Tables and chairs need to be returned to the original set-up at the end of each group session.

Ironing boards and irons are available; they are stored in the furnace room.

At the end of each studio session, groups need to take 10 minutes to empty the garbage cans, sweep the floor, disinfect the table tops, give the bathroom a wipe down, and wipe up any spills or spots if you have had a messy project day. Cleaning supplies for the Studio are under the sink in the kitchen. Bathroom cleaning and supplies are in the bathroom cabinet.

ACUA is following the Alberta Restriction Exemption program and REP protocols apply: visitors 12 and up will be required to provide proof of double vaccination, medical exemption, or a negative PCR or rapid test (privately paid, completed within the last 72 hours). Face masks are required for all visitors as well as physical distancing requirements. For further information: https://acuarts.ca/covid-update/.

For each studio date our groups need to take the following steps:

- Once your group is in, the front door should be locked so that the public flows through ACUA.
- Lead person of the group must verify Double Vaccination status and keep a list for fourteen days.
- Masks need to be worn at all times in the studio and physical distancing needs to be observed.

If the heat needs to be adjusted, please ask any staff at ACUA, and they will be happy to turn it up or down. It is on a schedule that doesn't necessarily align with studio times which can be uncomfortable during the winter.

When you arrive for a studio day, please park in one of the spots at the back of the building. If you are dropping things off at the front, please enter through the FFAA studio door, 9532 (south of the ACUA door).



African Mud **Cloth Designs**


FEBRUARY 19, 2022 | 1PM - 3:30PM
