The inaugural event in the new studio will be November 7. As of that date we are back in business! If you are wondering about your group's first date back please check with your group's studio liaison to confirm.





The Fabric of Canada

Have you heard of the Campaign for Wool--Canada? It's an initiative working to support the revival of the Canadian wool industry: https://campaignforwool.ca/.

"The Fabric of Canada" is a series of beautifully produced short films released to celebrate

Wool Month 2022 and consists of four projects for the month.

Week 1: **The 100-Mile Jacket** tells the journey of a blazer that was created all within a 100-mile radius of the City of Toronto from sheep to hanging for sale in the shop. The film talks about creating a connection to and deeper appreciation for the products that we consume, and emphasizes the importance of skilled artisans in creating local wool products. Week 2: **Coast Salish Weaving** celebrates traditional weaving and its important cultural and spiritual significance. Hereditary Chief Janice George of the Squamish First Nation set out to learn Coast Salish weaving as a teenager, however, she was not able to find anyone to teach her until decades later. The film tells the story of how Chief Janice George has set out to revive the technique by teaching Coast Salish weaving to others. Week 3: A Prairie Jubilee follows Manitoba Fibre Artist Rosemarie Péloquin in her creation of a 100% Canadian wool bust of the late Queen Elizabeth II as a commemoration of her Platinum Jubilee. In the film, Rosemarie speaks about building connections throughout the Manitoba wool value chain and working with local shepherds to source wool with the specific properties she seeks. Week 4: The Knitters of Newfoundland & Labrador highlights the story of NONIA and Yvonne Sheppard. NONIA is a social enterprise that allows families to supplement their incomes by knitting, employing roughly 175 knitters throughout the province. The NONIA knitting collective has been a part of Newfoundland & Labrador's cultural community for over a century and Yvonne has been a knitter for NONIA for 33 years. She had always been passionate about knitting, but when faced with difficult circumstances, she was able to turn to NONIA and has been knitting for them ever since.
